DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Under the direct supervision of the Project Coordinator, the Intervention Worker will be responsible for the completion of the following tasks:
- Work in collaboration with other staff members to create a culturally safe and peaceful environment;
- Welcome, listen, support and accompany clients;
- Assist clients in obtaining financial aid, identification, addiction support, housing, transportation and advocacy;
- Defuse conflict;
- Work in collaboration and liaise with other community organizations;
- Ensure the cleanliness, the efficiency and timely operations of the Center (e.g. kitchen, laundry, front desk, stock room, common area, etc.);
- Oversee the distribution of food and clothing;
- Encourage and supervise volunteers.
